## Budget Insights

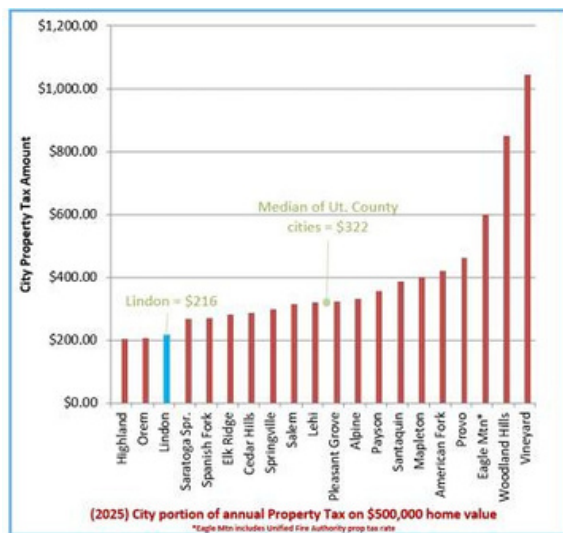
One of the key responsibilities of a city council member is ensuring the city's finances are managed wisely. Lindon City has long taken a conservative and careful approach to budgeting, and that consistency has helped keep the city in a strong financial position. I wanted to share a few budget insights that residents may find helpful in better understanding how Lindon City plans for the future and manages taxpayer dollars

**Property Taxes** - Lindon has not raised its property tax rate in more than 13 years. Any increases you may have seen on your property tax bill have come from other taxing entities—not from Lindon City. We've been able to avoid raising property taxes largely because of a strong sales-tax base generated by healthy commercial activity, much of it supported by shoppers from outside Lindon. A common misconception is that the city is responsible whenever property taxes go up, but in reality your property taxes are divided among four separate entities: Alpine School District, Utah County, the Central Utah Water Conservancy District (CUWCD), and Lindon City. The dollar-bill chart below shows how each of these entities contributes to your total property tax bill

**Grants and Donations** - One of the key strategies Lindon uses to keep taxes low is securing revenue from sources outside of our local tax base. Our city staff and elected officials have been remarkably successful in identifying and obtaining grants and donations from a wide range of public and private partners. Over the past 20 years, Lindon has received \$15,989,705 through these efforts. These funds have allowed us to build and maintain many of the amenities our residents enjoy—without placing additional tax burdens on our community

**Citizen Involvement** - Citizens are always encouraged to participate in Lindon's budget process. Each year, the proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year is released in late April or early May, giving residents time to review it. From May through June, the City Council holds public meetings and budget hearings where citizens can share their views, ask questions, and provide feedback directly. Residents are also welcome to reach out with questions or comments at any time throughout the year

## Letters to Santa

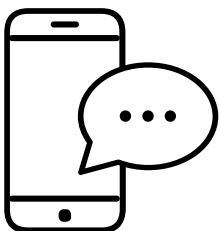

# Public Works Pointers

## Snow Plow

Winter is here and our snow plow drivers need your help? Please move your vehicles and trailers off city streets during active snow storms and don't park on the street within 48 hours after a snow storm. (Even after it stops snowing our crews may be plowing.) Our plow drivers prioritize snow removal first on major collector roads and steep/hillside roadways, followed by other through-streets, and then dead-end and cul-de-sacs. They may also adjust the streets according to their travel direction. During significant storms with lots of snow accumulation the plow drivers may have to repeatedly plow higher priority streets, thus lower priority streets will take longer to be cleared.

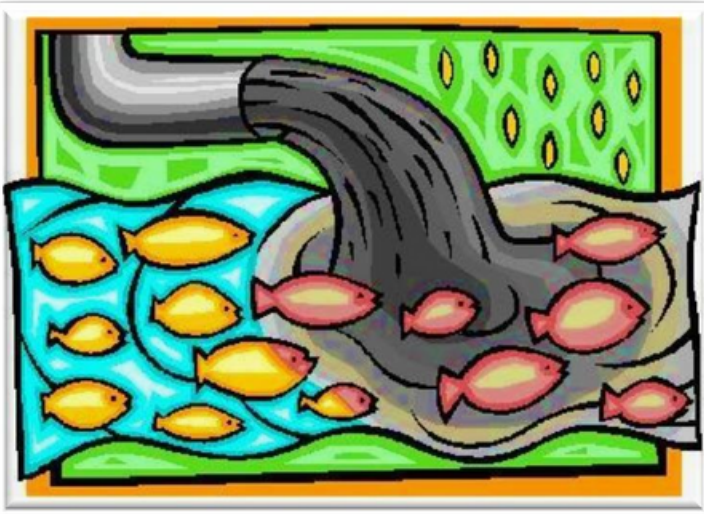
## Storm Water Pollution Prevention: Paint

If you're using latex-water based paints, you can wash your paint brushes directly in your kitchen or bathroom sink.

Don't rinse your brushes into the street. If you use oil-based paints, clean them by rinsing brushes with solvent in a container.



Never dump paint in the trash, gutter, or storm drain

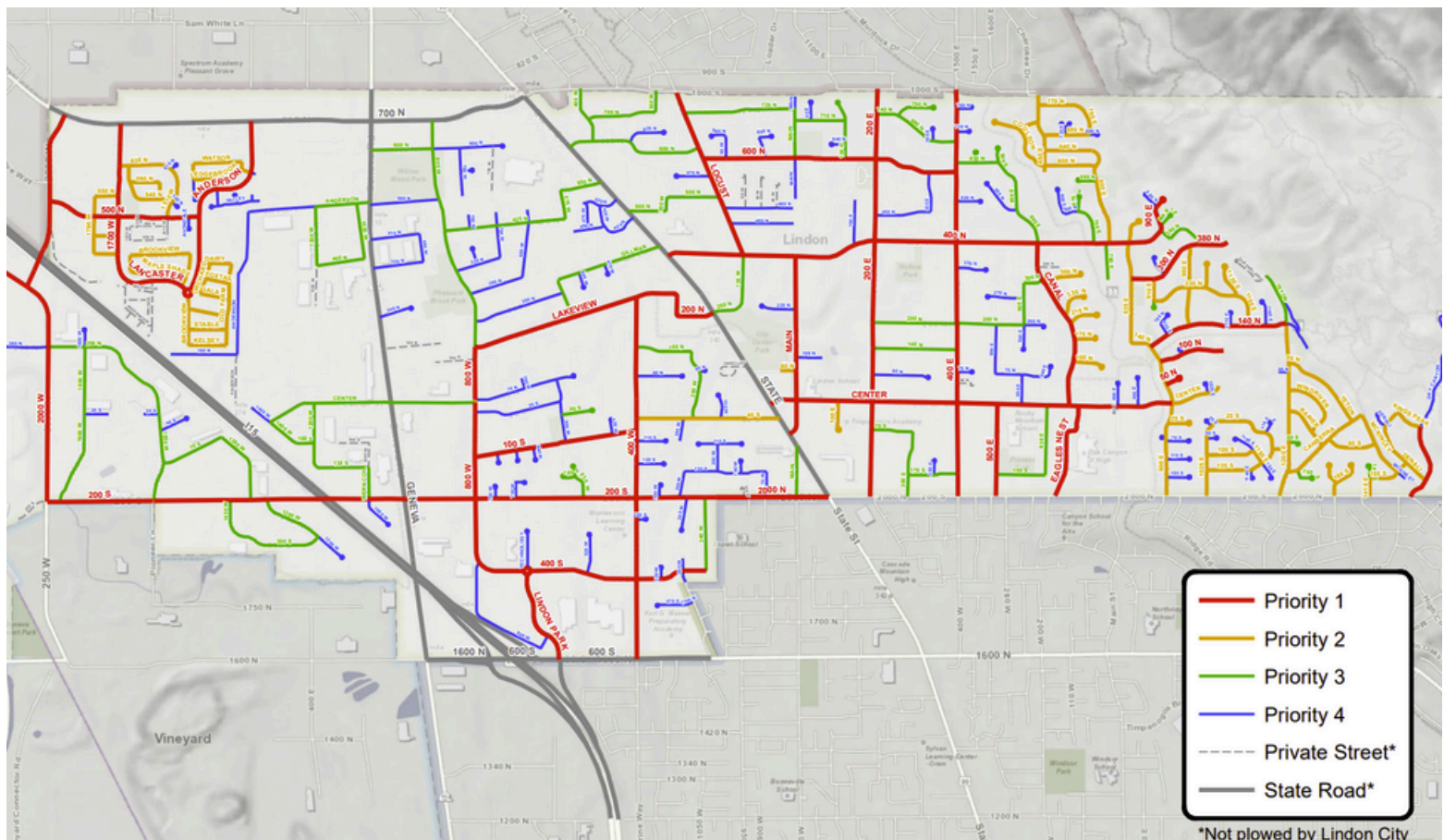




## WINTER PARKING & SNOW REMOVAL

Winter is here and our snow plow drivers need your help? Please move your vehicles and trailers off city streets during active snow storms and don't park on the street within 48 hours after a snow storm. (Even after it stops snowing our crews may be plowing.) We also ask that residents do not push snow into the streets. Please keep your sidewalks clear and salted, and be willing to assist your neighbors who have special needs with their snow removal as well! Lindon City prioritizes snow removal. First to be plowed are the main arteries, collector streets, and then local and residential streets. During a heavy snowstorm, most of our resources may be spent keeping the main arteries open and your street may not be plowed until resources become available. Please be patient and know that we will do our best to keep our streets clear. Let's all help to make life easier for our great snowplow drivers as they work to keep the roads safe for all of us! 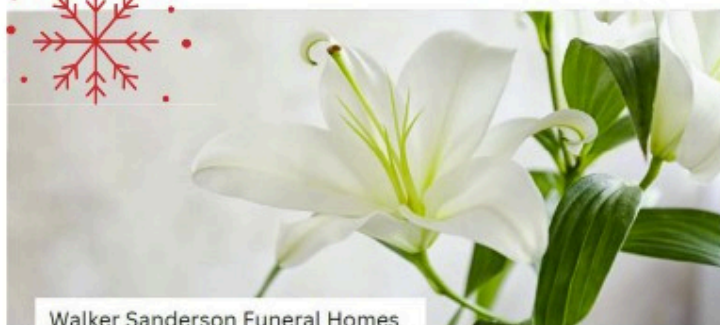

## Recipe's to Try

### Orange Cranberry Cookies

#### Ingredients:

1/2 cup all-purpose flour  
1/2 tsp. baking soda  
1/4 tsp. kosher salt  
1 1/2 cups old-fashioned oats  
3/4 cup dried cranberries  
2 tsp. grated orange zest  
1 stick salted butter, at room temperature  
1/2 cup packed dark brown sugar  
1/4 cup granulated sugar  
1 large egg  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
4 oz. white chocolate, chopped



#### Instructions:

1 Preheat the oven to 350°. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Combine the dry ingredients in a medium bowl.  
2 Combine the butter and both sugars in a large bowl and beat with a mixer on medium speed until light and fluffy. Add the egg and vanilla and beat until combined. Gradually beat in the dry ingredients.  
3 Drop tablespoonfuls of dough onto the baking sheets, about 2 inches apart. Bake until the cookies are golden brown around the edges, rotating the pans halfway through, 14 to 16 minutes. Let the cookies cool for 5 minutes on the pans, then remove to a rack to cool completely.  
4 Put the white chocolate in a medium microwave-safe bowl and microwave in 30-second intervals, stirring, until melted. Drizzle over the cookies. Refrigerate until set, about 5 minutes.
