Your Voice Matters

On January 20, the Utah Legislature will convene for the 2026 General Session at the State Capitol. Over the following weeks, lawmakers will debate and vote on hundreds of bills that will affect everything from taxes and transportation to education, water use, public safety, and local government authority. For residents of Lindon, this session is much more than just a gathering of politicians meeting in distant hall or stuffy chambers. It is a chance for all of us to stay informed and to participate in the decision-making process that directly shapes our community and our daily lives.

Why Paying Attention Matters

State laws have real, local consequences. Legislative decisions can influence how cities fund infrastructure, how schools are supported (particularly relevant with the splitting of the Alpine School District), how property rights are defined, and how public services are delivered. Even bills that sound technical or obscure can have lasting impacts.

During the debates surrounding the adoption of the U.S. Constitution in 1787, James Madison and other Founding Fathers stressed the need for wide participation in government. They recognized the fewer people who participate, the greater the risk that small interest groups will come to dominate the government. Conversely, they saw that the greater the participation of the people, the more likely the real will of the community as a whole will be reflected.

Participation does not require agreement with any particular political viewpoint. Civic engagement is about understanding the issues, forming your own opinions, and making sure your elected officials know where you stand on any given bill being considered—whether in support, opposition, or somewhere in between.

How Lindon Residents Can Stay Informed

Utah provides excellent public access to the legislative process. By visiting le.utah.gov, residents can:

- Read bill summaries and full texts
- Track which committees are hearing specific bills
- Watch committee meetings and floor debates live or on replay
- See how legislators vote on individual measures

In his famous Gettysburg Address, Abraham Lincoln spoke of the need for each of us to make a renewed commitment to preserving the government “for the people.” But his words also emphasized that a government for the people cannot exist unless it remains a government of the people and by the people.

Let's all make the Utah Legislature a true government “for the people” by taking time to see that this session is one that is “of the people” by participating and by letting our voices and opinions be heard.

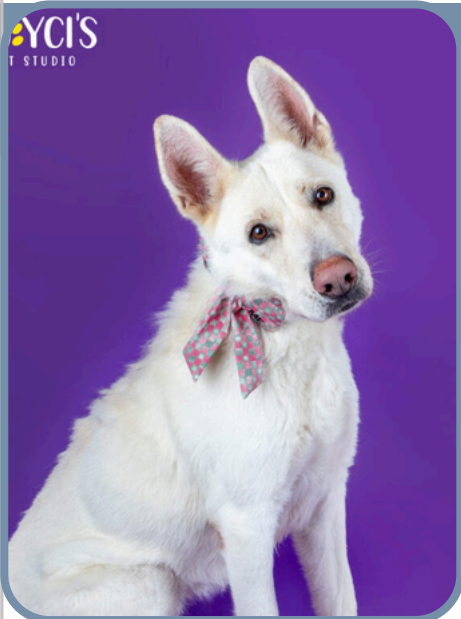
Happening Now

The Lindon City Stormwater Division would like to thank all of you for your work in helping to remove leaves from your yards and gutters. This greatly helps to minimize flooding danger from clogged stormwater inlets. We would also like to thank those who were able to dispose of their bags in the dumpsters provided by the city or by bringing them over to the Public Works yard. This was an additional help to our hard-working Public Works employees who were aided by Adam Cowie, our City Administrator. Together they gathered over 6,100 leaf bags. Thanks again for the combined efforts of our citizens and employees.



Storm Water Pollution Prevention:

What you can do if you see illicit discharge

Storm water runoff is any precipitation (rain, sleet, snow, or hail) that flows over land instead of seeping into the ground. In developed areas, rainwater travels over paved areas, picking up the debris from streets, and flows through storm drains. Storm water is NOT treated and can pollute rivers, streams, creeks, and lakes.



So what can you do about polluted runoff?

The easiest way to deal with pollution is to prevent it from happening in the first place.



Wash the family car on the lawn, not on the road or driveway.

Never dump anything down the storm drain! It is meant only for rainwater.

Take a look at what your school is doing to prevent polluted runoff. Could you and your classmates do more?

Clean up after your pet! Bring bags along when you walk your dog and encourage others to do the same

Don't leave grass clippings and leaves in the street when you help with the yard work. Use them for fertilizer, compost them, or bag them.

Don't litter!

If you see illicit discharge

Many times people pollute water and don't know they are doing it. Now that you have the facts about polluted runoff, teach other people about it.

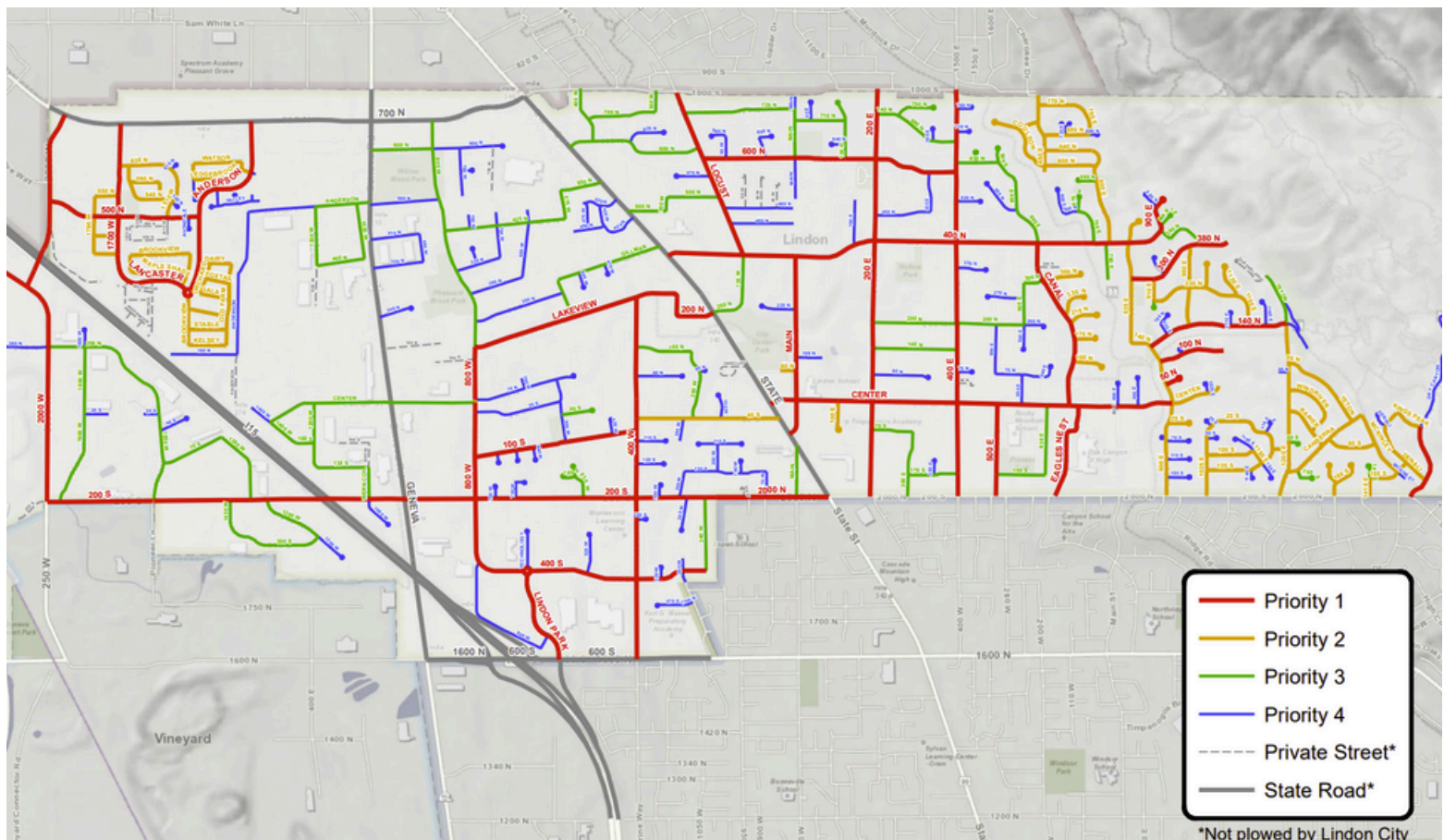

WINTER PARKING & SNOW REMOVAL

Although we are still seeing warmer temperatures this winter, when it starts to snow our crews will be out plowing our streets. So here are a few reminders. If your street or cul-de-sac is not being plowed, the most probable reason is that there are cars parked along the side of the roads. Please move your vehicles and trailers off city streets during active snow storms and don't park on the street within 48 hours after a snow storm. (Even after it stops snowing our crews may still be plowing.) Our plow drivers prioritize snow removal first on major collector roads and steep/hillside roadways, followed by other through-streets, and then dead-ends and cul-de-sacs. They may also adjust the streets according to their travel direction. During significant storms with lots of snow accumulation, the plow drivers may have to repeatedly plow higher priority streets, thus lower priority streets will take longer to be cleared. Thanks for your patience during these types of snow storm events!
