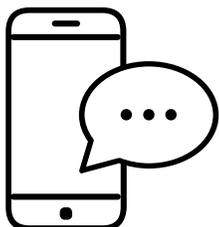

# Public Works Pointers

## Lindon City Cemetery

As the warmer spring weather approaches it is time for the cemetery to receive its first mowing of the year. Here is a reminder of some of the guidelines for decorations which add to the beauty and character of the cemetery and keep our maintenance staff safe. Please remove any non-regulation items that you would like to keep by March

**Grave decorations must be placed directly on top of the headstone.** Any object placed

in the grass area or extending over the grass area will be removed and discarded.

- Any objects driven into the ground such as wires, ornamental iron, shepherd hooks, solar lights, sticks, pegs, flags, toys, air socks, balloons, outdoor lighting, pinwheels, etc. are not permitted and will be discarded.
- Shepherd hooks or similar ornamental iron for hanging decorations are only permitted if secured to the headstone by means of holes drilled into the headstone or by other secure attachment directly on top of the headstone.
- Glass, porcelain, bottles, picture frames, breakable containers or any items deemed hazardous, inappropriate or conflicting with maintenance of a cemetery may be removed and discarded at any time by cemetery personnel.
- Outlining of headstones using bricks, rocks, flowers or other decorations or devices is prohibited.

Thank you so much for your help in keeping our cemetery beautiful and safe for those who work to maintain it.



## STORMWATER WHAT IS IT? WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?



Stormwater is precipitation (from either rain or snow melt) that falls on impervious surfaces, like streets or the roof of our house, and flows over them and into storm drains that lead directly to our lakes and rivers.

Water flowing over hard surfaces picks up pollutants along the way. Common pollutants include yard waste, motor oil, leaf litter, trash and salt used during the winter. Runoff containing these pollutants and flowing into storm drains is NOT treated before flowing directly into our lakes and waterways.

## YOU CAN HELP KEEP OUR WATERWAYS CLEAN BY:

- Never pile landscaping materials in the street.
- Using de-icing products sparingly and according to manufacturer's instructions
- Clean leaves, sediment and trash out of gutters and dispose of in garden or trash.
- Apply lawn and garden chemicals sparingly and according to instructions

## Recipe's to Try

### PineappleChicken & Rice

#### Ingredients:

- 1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 can (20 ounces) unsweetened pineapple chunks, undrained
- ¼ cup barbecue sauce
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 cup uncooked rice (of your choice)
- ½ tsp salt

#### Instructions:

1. Combine all ingredients in an instapot. Lock lid; close and pressure-release valve. Adjust to pressure-cook on high for 20 minutes.
2. Let pressure release naturally. Remove chicken to a cutting board and shred with 2 forks. Add chicken back to the pot and stir until combined. Sprinkle with cilantro and green onions if desired.

# Message from Lindon City Emergency Management

My name is Todd Christensen, and I would like to introduce myself as the new Lindon City Emergency Manager. I recently retired after 20 years of active-duty service as an officer in the Utah Army National Guard. I have experience in military support for emergency operations, operational and logistical planning, and emergency response. I also have experience as a preparedness and survival instructor. I am committed to helping Lindon City and its residents become better prepared to respond to emergency situations.

I encourage all residents and families to become better prepared. Prepared individuals and families are the foundation of community preparedness.

Personal and family preparedness rely on a foundation of physical fitness, mental health and resilience, spiritual health, and sound financial stewardship. I encourage all residents to improve their capabilities in each of these areas.

Become informed about what hazards you may face at home, at work, on your commute, and during your leisure activities and hobbies. I recommend having an emergency kit or emergency preparedness items that are immediately accessible wherever you are. I recommend an everyday-carry emergency kit, vehicle kits, home kits, and emergency kits in your workplace. Chances are you might not be home when an emergency strikes.

Throughout the year I will be hosting Community Preparedness courses. Please check the Lindon City Facebook and Instagram pages for more information on these courses. I will be posting preparedness information in future newsletters as well as on [lindon.gov/emergency-preparedness.htm](http://lindon.gov/emergency-preparedness.htm) and [lindoncitydrill.org](http://lindoncitydrill.org).
